35th Annual Christmas Bird Count (2016)

Co-sponsored by the MH Interpretive Program and The Society of Grasslands Naturalists

Dear Birder:

Many thanks to the 41 participants who surveyed territories during the 35th anniversary of the Medicine Hat Christmas Bird Count (CBC) held on Sunday, December 18. Also, a big thank you goes out to the 18 feeder watchers who participated including 3 new contributors. The Interpretive Program continues to ask Hatters with feeders to monitor them on count day and there has been a consistent group of 15 to 25 observers annually. Having these folks participate usually adds one or more species seen exclusively by feeder watchers to the count's species total.

Count day temperatures were relatively mild (Low = -10° /High = -1° C); however, it was a blustery day with wind speeds of 40-50 km/hr and gusts to 90 km/hr. Most observers reported reduced bird activity for their assigned areas and feeder watchers also indicated the same. Snow levels were low and no one reported any difficulties with access. All 24 territories were assigned and surveyed this year.

Despite the windy conditions, 52 species were observed, which was 1 more than 2015, similar to species totals since 2001 (average = 55), and about 15% above the long-term average (34 years) of 45. The wind likely impacted the number of individual birds observed. In 2016, there were 18,337 individual birds counted, which was 38% below last year's record total of 29,451. The 2016 number was still relatively close to the 10-year average (20,400) and 40% above the long-term average (13,262). Declines in individuals observed were most apparent with Canada Geese and Mallards as they were down 48% and 40%, respectively from 2015. It is possible the windy conditions kept these species grounded in areas inaccessible to observers, although some individuals may have left the area because of frigid temperatures earlier in December. One other species, European Starling, exhibited a large decline; this year's total (380) was the lowest since 2010 (471) and 68% less than last year (1,197) and 14% below the long-term average (442). In comparison, Starling's averaged 1,274 from 2011 through 2015. Reasons for the 1-year decline are not clear at this time.

Feeder watchers observed 1 species (Sharp-shinned Hawk) exclusive of those monitoring assigned territories. One species, White-breasted Nuthatch was observed during Count Week but not on Count Day. No new species to the count were found in 2016.

Similarly to 2015, there were 2 species with high counts this year and they were Eurasian Collared-doves (211, previous high 147 in 2013) and American Crows (62, previous high 41 in 2014). Collared-doves first appeared on our CBC in 2003 and have increased steadily since then. The record Crow numbers this year were mirrored by an 34% increase in Black-billed Magpie numbers from 2015 and were indicative of Corvids returning to levels similar to those observed before West Nile impacted populations from 2004 to 2009.

Regarding the Top Ten Species, the list remained consistent from 2015 with Canada Goose and Mallard leading the way despite fewer individuals observed this year. The 2 most noticeable changes were European Starlings dropping down from third to the seventh position and Common Redpolls were replaced by Snow Buntings. The Snow Buntings were seen in 2 flocks by the same observer south of Medicine Hat.

Three species of note reappeared on the CBC in 2016 after short absences. Horned Larks (79) had not been observed in 5 years and the 2 waxwings (Bohemian, 51 and Cedar, 5) were absent from the 2015 CBC. Four other species were observed this year after extensive absences: Hooded Merganser (2, last seen 2004), Song Sparrow (1, last seen 2004), Western Meadowlark (2, last seen 2007), and Brewer's Blackbird (3, last seen 1999). Other species generally counted on our CBC that were seen in 2016 but not in 2015 included: Sharp-shinned Hawk (1), Northern Goshawk (2), Northern Shrike (1), Brown Creeper (3), Golden-crowned Kinglet (1), and Townsend's Solitaire (1).

There were 26 species typically seen on our CBC that were not observed in 2016 (see full list in table below). Of those, 6 species have not been observed for more than 5 years: Canvasback (2008), Greater Scaup (2009), Northern Harrier (2005), Short-eared Owl (2010), Purple Finch (2009), and Evening Grosbeak (2007).




